Scorekeeper Test A

Carefully read the directions for each section. Assume that twelve substitutions are allowed per team, per set. Do not write on this exam, use the answer sheet for scorekeeper Test A to record all answers.

TRUE OR FALSE

For questions 1 through 15, read each question carefully. Do not assume anything other than what is stated. Decide if the situation described is true or false. Use T for true and use F for false. Use the answer sheet.

1. When completing the OFFICIALS section of the USAV score sheet, before the set begins, the names are to be written last name, first initial (ie., SMITH, J.).
2. If the coach or captain tells the scorekeeper to use the line-up from set 1 for set 2, then the coach or captain does not have to rewrite the line-up and sign it.
3. When a play-over is awarded, the scorekeeper circles the number of the next point in the running score column of both teams.
4. When recording the team letter in the A/B column of the SANCTIONS section, the team on the left is always A.
5. When recording the score in the SANCTIONS or REMARKS section, the score of the team involved is written first.
6. The first sanction in set 2 for team Gold is a team delay. Later in the same set, team Gold requests a 13th player substitution. An improper request is charged to team Gold.
7. When the scorekeeper receives team Blue's line-up, he/she notices that the captain is not marked. The scorekeeper asks the second referee to take the line-up back to team Blue to complete the line-up. Team Blue marks #8, the Libero, with a "c" to indicate captain. When the scorekeeper gets the line-up back, he/she records the information and hands the line-up to the second referee just before the set begins.
8. Each non-deciding set ends officially when the first referee signals change of sides to the teams.
9. A rally must always take place between two Libero replacements on the same team.
10. When points are removed due to a wrong server or illegal player in the set, all timeouts, team sanctions, individual sanctions, and substitutions during that span of points are also removed.
11. After the scorekeeper receives the line-ups, no changes may be made unless a substitution is used.

12. When one team asks for information about the other team, such as number of substitutions left, time-outs, etc., the scorekeeper may reply with the information.
13. When a team wishes to protest the application of a rule, the protest must be filed prior to the authorization of the next serve.
14. An exceptional substitution does not count as one of the team substitutions.
15. Team Blue indicates on the line-up for set 1 that player #7 will be the Libero. For set 2, team Blue turns in the line-up indicating the six starting players only. After the first serve of set 2, the Libero #7 replaces player #11 in the middle back position and play continues.

MULTIPLE CHOICE

For questions 16 through 41, read each question completely and carefully. Do not assume anything other than what is stated. Decide which answer is the best choice regarding the given situation by selecting the appropriate letter.

16. One of the teams requests a time-out. The scorekeeper records this in what order?
 - A. The score of the team that called the time-out is the first score written.
 - B. The score of the team that is serving is the first score written.
17. At the end of Set 1, how is the final information recorded?

WRONG/ILLEGAL PLAYER SITUATIONS

For questions 60 through 66, read each situation carefully. Do not assume anything other than what is stated. Indicate the action from those listed that must be taken to correct the given situation by selecting the appropriate letter. The correct player is placed on the court when necessary. Use the answer sheet.

- A. An improper request is noted.
 - B. A team delay is charged.
 - C. Points scored by the offending team are removed, and the other team is awarded the ball.
 - D. Points scored by the offending team are removed; no further action.
 - E. The other team is awarded the ball by loss of rally.
 - F. Points scored by the offending team are retained; no further action.

- 60. A player on the receiving team attempts to enter a wrong position but does not enter.

 - 62. The serving team scores two points and calls for a time-out. After the time-out, the serving team scores two more points, then it loses the rally. The scorekeeper discovers that there was a wrong server before the other team serves.
 - 63. The Libero for the receiving team exchanges with the wrong player and is discovered before the serving team serves.
 - 64. The Libero for the serving team does not get replaced when he/she rotates into the left front position. This is caught by the assistant scorekeeper after the serving team scores a point, followed by a Libero exchange.

- 65. After team Gold serves and scores four points, then loses the ball; and team Blue serves a point, the scorekeeper discovers that a wrong player has been in the set for team Gold.
- 66. After team Gold serves and scores a point and a loss of rally, and team Blue serves a loss of rally, it is discovered that the Libero for team Gold exchanged for the wrong player before team Gold's previous serve.

CORRECT OR INCORRECT

For questions 67 through 76, read each situation carefully. Do not assume anything other than what is stated. Indicate if the given situation is handled correctly or incorrectly. Use C for correct and use I for incorrect. Use the answer sheet.

- 67. When an illegal Libero exchange is made, the assistant scorekeeper waits until after the contact of the serve is made before informing the second referee.
- 68. Through the course of the set, team Blue has substituted #6 for #2, #7 for #6, #2 for #7, and now calls a substitution of #8 for #2. The scorekeeper records the substitution and play continues.
- 69. In set 3, team Gold calls for a substitution, #9 for #4. Player #9 was expelled in set 1, so remembering this, the scorekeeper reminds the second referee. The substitution is declared illegal and denied with team Gold being charged a team delay.
- 70. Team Blue calls its 3rd time-out of the set. Team Blue is charged with a team delay.
- 71. In a deciding 3rd set of a match, before point eight, when a substitution is made by the team on the scorekeeper's left, it is recorded on the left side and the far right side of the sheet.

- 72. Champions player #1 is allowed to replace the Libero.

- 74. Champions player #22 runs on the court to replace the Libero, and then immediately is replaced by substituting #1 for #22. The information is recorded and play continues.

75. Team Gold quickly turns in a new line-up to the scorekeeper following set 1. There is 1 minute and 30 seconds left between sets. The second referee takes the line-up sheet from the table and allows the team Gold to make a change without a substitution.
76. During the check of line-ups on the court prior to the set, the scorekeeper finds a wrong player on the court for team Blue. The correct player as listed on the line-up sheet is placed on the court without sanction.
